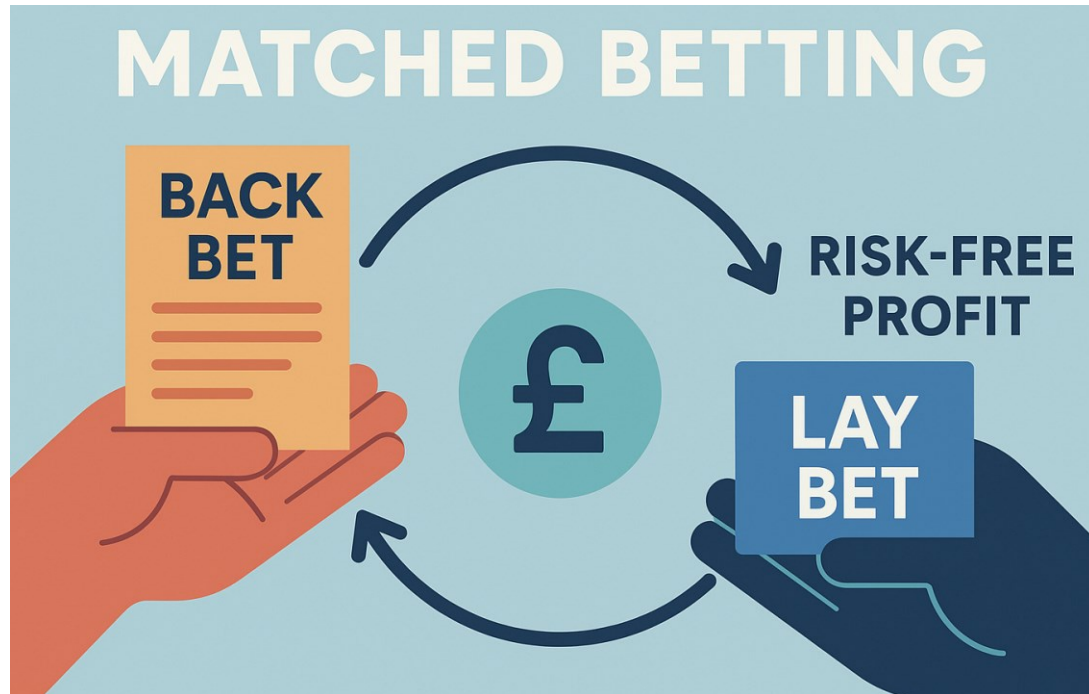

# Matched Betting: Opportunity or Risk?



A betting technique that uses free bet promotions from bookmakers to '**guarantee a profit**' by placing bets on all outcomes of an event

- Place a **back bet** with a bookmaker
- Place a **lay bet** on a betting exchange
- Exploit **promotional offers** to fund bets

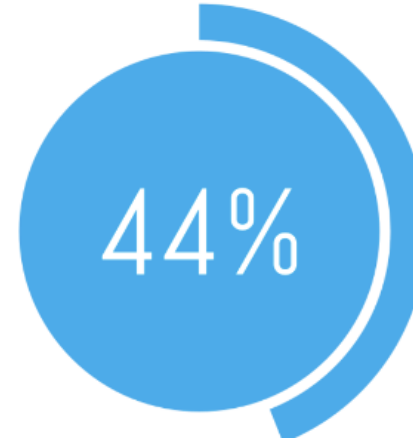
## Why it matters:

- ⚠️ Claimed to be 'risk-free' – but is it?
- 📺 Heavily advertised to students and new mothers
- 💰 A small error can mean substantial losses

# Screening Survey ( $n = 7041$ )

**Matched Bettors show significantly greater gambling  
severity than those with no Matched Betting experience  
( $p < .001$ )**

## GAMBLING SEVERITY (PGSI):

23.3% (LOW RISK; 1-2)

18.6% (MODERATE RISK; 3-7)

14.2% (HIGH RISK; 8+)



## GAMBLING HARMS (GHS-20):

22.5% (LOW HARM; 1-2)

14.8% (MODERATE HARM; 3-5)

19.3% (HIGH HARM; 6+)
